APRR – 3Q2007 Revenue and Traffic Results

Traffic

Total traffic measured in kilometres travelled increased by 2.7% in the third quarter, with increases of 2.6% and 3.0% for light vehicles and heavy goods vehicles, respectively.

In the third quarter, APRR's consolidated revenues totalled €508.3 million, an 8.3% increase from €469.4 million the previous year. Toll revenues for the period were up 8.4%.

Total traffic measured in kilometres travelled increased by 2.6% in the first nine months of September 2007, with a 2.5% increase for light vehicles and 2.9% for heavy goods vehicles.

These trends were in line with the recovery that began in the second quarter of 2006 for heavy goods vehicles and in the fourth quarter of 2006 for light vehicles.

A new 10 km motorway section on the A51 entered into service in March 2007, but did not have a material impact on the Group's overall traffic.

APRR's nine-month consolidated revenues totalled €1,372.3 million in 2007, up 8.5% from €1,265.1 million the previous year.

The growth in traffic volume, notably that of HGV traffic, combined with tariff increases generated an 8.5% increase in toll revenues relative to the same period in 2006.

Other revenues, which accounted for approximately 2.7% of the total, rose by 10.1% for retail facilities and 2.9% for the telecommunications and other businesses.

Continued development of electronic toll collection

In the first nine months of 2007, the number of active Liber-t badges sold by the Group was up 24% from the previous year.

Nine-month electronic toll collection accounted for 27.8% of all transactions (26.7% for light vehicles and 1.1% for heavy goods vehicles), up from 24.3% the previous year (light vehicles only).

Electronic toll collection for heavy goods vehicles is beginning to grow, with a 7.5% transaction rate at 30 September 2007.

The nine-month automated transaction rate in 2007 was 56.6%, up from 49.2% the previous year.

Tariffs

Toll tariffs are revised each year based on a contractual agreement with the State. Since 2004, this revision has taken place every 1 October for the APRR Group network.

This year, the following tariff increases were established and approved by the State for light vehicles (class 1): 0.92% for the *Autoroutes Paris-Rhin-Rhône* (APRR) network and 0.75% for the *Autoroutes Rhône-Alpes* (AREA) network.

For heavy goods vehicles (class 4), the average increases were 1.93% and 2.55% on the APRR and AREA networks, respectively.

Group refinancing

APRR signed a seven-year, €500 million credit facility agreement.

APRR also established a €6 billion euro medium-term note facility (EMTN), whose prospectus was submitted to the Luxembourg Stock Exchange on 3 October.

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Autoroutes Paris-Rhin-Rhône Group

Europe's fourth-largest motorway company, APRR Group, a subsidiary of Eiffage, operates 2,215 km of the 2,279 km privately-managed motorway network available under concession from the State.

The Group's motorway network is a major communications axis in Europe, and in 2006 recorded more than 20 billion kilometres travelled. Last year, the Group posted consolidated revenues of €1,670 million and net profit of €263 million, with nearly 4,200 employees.
